GOVERNING BOARD OF A CENTRE

(vocational training centre and adult education centre)

This diagram provides an overview of the composition of a centre governing board. The exact composition may vary from centre to centre. It is important to refer to the Education Act in all circumstances.

For a vocational training centre, at least

parents of students

attending the centre. These parents are not members of the staff of the centre and are elected by their peers according to the procedure determined by the director.

Students

attending the centre, elected by their peers according to the procedure determined by the director after consulting with the students or the students' association, if applicable

members of the staff of the centre

elected by their peers, including at least two teachers, one non-teaching professional staff member and one support staff member

persons appointed by the school service centre

after consulting with the socio-economic and community groups in the territory mainly served by the centre

At least

persons appointed by the school service centre

selected from within businesses of the region which, in the case of a vocational training centre, operate in economic sectors corresponding to vocational training programs offered by the centre

PLEASE NOTE:

- The positions of chair and vice-chair are selected from among the elected parents representatives and the members appointed by the school service centre. The chair and vice-chair hold their positions for one year.
- All categories of staff should be represented on the governing board to ensure that the entire centre team can participate.

NUMBER OF REPRESENTATIVES

The school service centre determines the number of representatives on the governing board after consulting with each group. The total number of seats for staff representatives must not exceed the total number of seats for representatives of other groups.
