WHAT?

The implementation, by the Direction des services éducatifs complémentaires et de l'intervention en milieu défavorisé (DSECIMD), of virtual communities of practice and codevelopment groups in connection with proven practices for well-being at school

WHY?

- The post-pandemic reconstruction phase has begun and provides an opportunity to reflect on educational and pedagogical practices for ensuring well-being at school and, ultimately, educational success with a view to inclusivity.
- There is no question that a change in practices will be required as we emerge from the health crisis and a new normal gradually settles in. To ensure a successful transition, it is necessary to provide local support.

WHAT ARE THE OBJECTIVES?

- To identify promising practices in relation to well-being at school
- 2. To develop a well-being **practices guide** for schools
- To facilitate networking and collaborative practices between school teams, vocational training centres (VT), adult education centres (AGE), school service centres and school boards regarding projects on well-being that emerge in their community

WITH WHOM?

- The ministerial team associated with the Strategy to provide academic assistance and support well-being at school
- Representatives of the education network designated by the institutions and whose role it is to:
 - participate in meetings with the communities
 - share their experience and initiatives in the area of well-being
 - contribute to reflections on and the analysis and dissemination of best practices
- The institutions can use the allocations under the following operating budget measures to replace their staff temporarily, as needed:
 - For the public network: Measures 15021 and 15022
 - For private educational institutions accredited for the purposes of subsidies: Measures 30370 and 30371

WHEN?

- ACTIVITIES:
 - Four annual meetings (virtual)
 - Times proposed for 2021-2022: October, January, March and May
- DURATION: Three years
- DEADLINES FOR DELIVERABLES:
 - Dissemination of promising practices (Spring 2022)
 - Well-being practices guide (Spring 2024)







HOW MANY?

The number and type of communities will vary based on the interest shown and the resources available to ensure effective and efficient management:1

- Preschool and elementary school community: 12 to 15 participants
- Secondary school community (including VT and AGE):2 12 to 15 participants
- English sector community:2 To be determined
- Other communities (e.g. managers or persons responsible for the file): as needed
