GLOBUS CALL

Collaborate with Québec

Administered by the Nordic Council of Ministers, Globus Call welcomes projects that seek to expand traditional boundaries in their practice and strive to explore the interplay between the local and the global. The programme is designed to give artists and cultural practitioners opportunities to engage in transnational and long-term collaborations and networks. This international fund can support collaborations between Nordic artists and cultural organisations and their counterparts in Québec.

In the assessment, emphasis is placed on the ability to see from alternative positions and perspectives, and on ambitions to build mutual collaborations and sustainable ways of organising projects. Projects must have a clear link to the Nordic region in terms of partners, themes or activities, but there is no requirement of wider intra-Nordic collaboration.

An essential part of the programme is to build networks across the participants and initiatives that receive funding. During the project period, the supported projects will have the opportunity to meet and share knowledge and experience across the involved actors.

Important information on Globus Call

- Applications for Globus Call will be accepted from 15 May to 15 September 2023.
- The maximum amount that can be granted in the programme is DKK 700,000. The average grant in the first Call in 2022 was DKK 350,000.
- Applications can be submitted from all over the world.
 Applicants can be individuals, groups, associations, companies, public or private sector organisations or institutions.
- Projects which meet the assessment criteria of Project Funding and Opstart are not generally eligible for Globus funding. This applies, for example, to projects that focus primarily on activities or the development of co-operation within the Nordic region.
- If you are in the early stages of your project, you can apply for Globus Opstart to develop your project idea and further establish dialogue with potential partners.

FOUR NATIONS INTERNATIONAL FUND

The Four Nations International Fund will support those working in the arts and creative industries across the UK nations, together with international partners (including those from Québec).

With co-investment from Arts Council England, Arts Council Northern Ireland, Arts Council Wales/ Wales Arts International and Creative Scotland, the second round of the fund will support in-person, digital or hybrid activity including exchanges, residencies, partnership development, co-creation and networking, with priority given to applications experimenting with innovative models of international collaboration.

Applicants must have confirmed commitment from at least one artistic or creative partner based in another of the four nations – England, Northern Ireland, Scotland or Wales (this can be an individual or organisation) and commitment from an international artistic or creative partner (this can be an individual or an organisation).

Fund opens – 16 August 2023

Deadline for applications – 28 September 2023

DUNE PART II

In cinemas only across the Globe Directed by internationally-acclaimed director Denis Villeneuve

This follow-up film will explore the mythic journey of Paul Atreides as he unites with Chani and the Fremen while on a warpath of revenge against the conspirators who destroyed his family. Facing a choice between the love of his life and the fate of the known universe, he endeavours to prevent a terrible future only he can foresee.

About Denis Villeneuve

Internationally known for directing several critically acclaimed films, including the thrillers Prisoners and Sicario, as well as the science fiction films Arrival and Blade Runner 2049. For his work on Arrival, he received his first Academy Award nomination for Best Director. He was awarded the prize of Director of the Decade by the Hollywood Critics Association in December 2019.

His latest film, Dune, based on Frank Herbert's novel of the same name, premiered at the 78th Venice International Film Festival: the film received critical acclaim, was a commercial success at the box office internationally, and is his highest grossing film to date and earned him Academy Award nominations for Best Adapted Screenplay and Best Picture, with the film itself winning a leading six Oscars at the 94th Academy Awards.

His next film, Dune: Part Two is set to be released on November 3, 2023, by Warner Bros. Pictures.





MICHEL TREMBLAY

Michel Tremblay: Plays in Scots

Michel Tremblay: Plays in Scots is edited by Martin Bowman and contains in two volumes the translations by Martin Bowman and Bill Findlay of the eight plays by Québec playwrite Michel Tremblay that they translated from the vernacular French of Montréal into contemporary Scots. The energy, versatility and range of the Scots language capture the essence of Tremblay's drama. Between 1987 and 2003, these plays received professional productions in major theatres in Scotland; some of them toured beyond Scotland: to Toronto (Harbourfront Festival), Montréal (Centaur Theatre), New York (Stony Brook Festival) and London (The Barbican). Never before had a contemporary foreign playwright achieved such success in Scotland. Unlike most translations of plays into Scots, these scripts are not adaptations and as such demonstrate that the Scots language can be an excellent vehicle to represent works from other cultures and languages.

DANIEL BARROW

Studio du Québec à Londres

The Québec Studio in London is proud to welcome Daniel Barrow.

Montréal-based artist Daniel Barrow works in video, film, printmaking and drawing, but is best known for his use of antiquated technologies, his "registered projection" installations, and his narrative, overhead projection performances. Barrow describes his performance method as a process of "creating and adapting comic narratives to manual forms of animation by projecting, layering and manipulating drawings on overhead projectors".

Barrow has exhibited widely in Canada and abroad. He has performed at The Walker Art Center (Minneapolis), PS1 Contemporary Art Center (New York), The Museum of Contemporary Art (Los Angeles), Internationale Kurzfilmtage Oberhausen, The Portland Institute for Contemporary Art's TBA festival, and the British Film Institute's London Film Festival. Barrow is the winner of the 2010 Sobey Art Award as well as the recipient of the 2013 Glenfiddich Artist in Residence Prize.

About the Québec Studio in London

The Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec supports the goals of the Québec government to broaden the presence of Québec artists in internationally renowned cultural communities.

In 2008–2009, in partnership with Québec's Ministry of Culture and Communications and the Ministry of International Relations and the Francophonie, it established the Québec Studio in London, thereby expanding the network of residencies offered abroad to Québec artists and writers.

Gabrielle Boulianne-Tremblay is a writer and actor. Renowned for her role in the hard-hitting film *Ceux qui font les révolutions* à moitié n'ont fait que se creuser un tombeau, she was nominated for Best Support Actress at the Canadian Screen Awards; a first for a trans Canadian woman. Her appearance on Tout le Monde en Parle to raise awareness around trans realities has been welcomed by the LGBTQ+ community and allies alike.

Her novel *La fille d'elle-même* won the prestigious Prix des libraires du Québec in 2022. A poetry collection entitled *Les Secrets de l'origami* was published in 2018 by Busso éditeur.

Gabrielle has been invited by Folkuniversitetet to participate in a conversation with Françoise Sule, Vice President (Europe) for l'Association internationale des études québécoises (AIEQ). The AEIQ is a partner in this activity.

ADAM KINNER AND CHRISTOPHER WILLES MANUAL

26-28 October The Mitchell Library Glasgow, UK

MANUAL is a one-on-one performance that turns a public library into a space of sensory encounter and heightened awareness. Participants arrive on site with instructions to meet a guide, and from there they are silently led through a series of actions, following written notes and immersive audio in headphones. Through a carefully guided process, MANUAL stages a meditation on the library as a space of connection and awareness.

MANUAL premiered at OFFTA (Montréal) in June 2022, and was created with the support of Festival TransAmériques, Conseil des arts du Canada, Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec, and the Ontario Arts Council.



KIM THÚY

Dublin Literary Award

We would like to congratulate Québec writer Kim Thúy on making it to the shortlist with her novel Em at the Dublin Literary Award!

Kim Thúy's *Em* is a virtuosic novel of profound power and sensitivity, and an enduring affirmation of the greatest act of resistance: love. In the midst of war, an ordinary miracle: an abandoned baby is tenderly cared for by a young boy living on the streets of Saigon. Through the linked destinies of a family of characters, the novel takes its inspiration from historical events, from Operation Babylift, which evacuated thousands of biracial orphans from Saigon in April 1975, to the remarkable growth of the nail salon industry, dominated by Vietnamese expatriates all over the world.

About the Dublin Literary Award

The Dublin Literary Award honours excellence in world literature since 1996. Presented annually, the Award is one of the most significant literature prizes in the world, worth €100,000 for a single work of international fiction written or a work of fiction translated into English. If the winning book is in English translation, the author receives €75,000 and the translator, €25,000.

Each year, a longlist is created from the books nominated for the Award by invited public libraries in cities around the world; the esteemed panel of judges then face the monumental task of narrowing these titles down to a shortlist of no more than ten titles.

Jean-Michel Blais is a Montréal-based pianist, composer and performer with a classical background – and a neo-classical bent! His fifth opus, *Aubades*, constituted his very first work written for chamber orchestra. Dating from the Middle Ages, the *Aubades* is a romantic piece sung at dawn by troubadours, often under the window of a loved one. Thus, like a sunrise at dusk, the concert is meant to be a twilight giving way to dawn, celebrating an instrumental rebirth, a flourishing season, a serenade of the dawn. This collection of *Aubades*, presented here in a quartet version, invites the piano, the violin and the cello, but also the clarinet, the flute and the saxophone, to twirl around in a delicate and optimistic musical offering.



The trio are set to release their drone meets doom metal album nature morte in February.

Outsider avant-blues from Montréal's meandering folk cowboy. Channelling magical realism, country rock and Lou Reed, wandering stalwart Konner Whitney merges outsider folk and political poetry with Cale-esque experimentation. His 2022 EP Hard To Be A God is a hallucinatory journey into Appalachian dreamscapes, neo-psych guitar loops and free-flowing poetry. It's safe to say we're hooked.

End of the Road has a unique atmosphere, relaxed and friendly but serious about music. The beautiful pleasure gardens at Larmer Tree form an ideal place to create a woodland wonderland, strewn with art installations and decorated spaces. There is a musical edge to almost everything on site with the literary and film programmes being rich in musically-related material.

ATMA Classique has established a sterling reputation around the world for recordings with superb sound quality, featuring distinctive programmes performed by some of the world's finest musicians. Founded in 1994 by Johanne Goyette, ATMA was acquired in April 2020 by Guillaume Lombart, founder and president of Ad Litteram, a leading company with more than 20 years of experience in the music industry.

Distributed in 25 countries and present on all digital platforms, the ATMA catalogue now comprises more than 550 titles in genres ranging from medieval to contemporary music, including tango, traditional, and baroque music. ATMA recordings are notable for their high standards, and original, creative programmes, which have garnered praise and numerous awards and prizes over the years.

In September 2021, the ATMA catalogue started being distributed in Europe by Proper Music Distribution, the largest independently owned and operated distributor of music in the UK.

Through this new partnership between ATMA Classique and Proper, a host of Québec musicians and their work are now available in the UK.





Claude Debussy: Images oubliées Stéphane Tétreault and Olivier Hébert-Bouchard

Release date UK: March 2023

Stéphane Tétreault and Olivier Hébert-Bouchard, Québec musicians, present Images oubliées (Forgotten images), their first volume of music by Claude Debussy transcribed for cello and piano. With Debussy's Sonata for Cello and Piano as the programme's centerpiece, Images oubliées explores original transcriptions of pieces such as Rêverie, Danse bohémienne, La plus que lente, and the renowned "Clair de lune".

Chopin Recital 4Janina Fialkowska

Release date UK: April 2023

Chopin Recital 4 features the celebrated pianist Janina Fialkowska, a towering figure on the international classical music scene. She has made 14 much-admired recordings for ATMA Classique since her label debut in 2005, including six devoted exclusively to Chopin, a composer for whom she has a great affinity. Chopin Recital 4 concludes a project that began in 2009, based on Fialkowska's desire to create four recitals around Chopin's Ballades and Scherzos.

Anguille sous roche (Something fishy) Les Voix humaines

Release date UK: May 2023

Anguille sous roche (Something fishy), is the first recording by the latest incarnation of renowned Québec viol duo Les Voix humaines. The new pairing consists of Mélisande Corriveau, who succeeds the duo's co-founder Margaret Little, and Susie Napper. Both play on historic viols by London luthier, Barak Norman. This album features delicacies from the French repertoire that are infused with humour, virtuosity, and tenderness.

Femmes de légende Élisabeth Pion

Release date UK: August 2023 (tbc)

Femmes de légende is the debut solo album by Québec pianist Élisabeth Pion, featuring works by three giants of the 20th century; Debussy, Dutilleux, and Boulanger, along with "Femmes de légende" by late-Romantic composer Mel (Mélanie) Bonis, and the "Berceuse" from opera The Exterminating Angel by Thomas Adès. "To me, releasing this recording is in a way giving birth to my artistic vision," says Pion.

A time for celebration! In November 2023, the Huddersfield Contemporary Music Festival will host the Québec-based and internationally renowned Quatuor Bozzini. The string quartet will perform in concert to celebrate their long-lasting friendship and collaboration with composer Jürg Frey on the art of slow, almost static, and always humble music. As part of the events surrounding the composer's 70th birthday, the ensemble will perform Frey's String Quartet no.4, composed specifically for the

quatuor. This performance will coincide with the ensemble's album launch of the piece (autumn 2023) on their own label, Collection QB. Stéphanie Bozzini, the violist of the Quartet, will also

Dana Michel masters the art of diverting the functions of objects, creating situations with an elusive logic. Everything in her approach escapes binarity or linearity; she deconstructs normative behaviour and favours absurdity over provocation. In short, she questions the modes of existence with humour and depth. For her three-hour performance MIKE, she started with a question: if we cannot be ourselves at work, where we spend most of our lives - what kind of lives are we living? To find an answer, she creates a meditation on the work environment, transforming daily actions into choreographic experiments. Yet every action is interrupted, seemingly losing its fluidity, as if her body has become imprisoned by routine repetition.







Pulse Topology

16-19 November Durham, UK

Lumiere, the UK's light art biennial, returns to Durham in November 2023, with a brand-new programme of more than 30 light art works by UK and international artists. At its heart will be the UK Premiere of *Pulse Topology* by Montréal-based artist Rafael Lozano-Hemmer, an immersive artwork of light and sound composed of thousands of light bulbs, exhibited in the nave of Durham Cathedral. Each light bulb is activated by the recorded heartbeat of the participants, contributing to a glimmering, connective arrangement through which the audience are invited to traverse.

Lozano-Hemmer is a media artist working at the intersection of architecture and performance art. He creates platforms for public participation using technologies such as robotic lights, digital fountains, computerized surveillance, media walls, and telematic networks. He was the first artist to represent Mexico at the Venice Biennale with an exhibition at Palazzo Van Axel in 2007 and his large-scale interactive installations have been commissioned for events all over the world. His many awards include the title of Compagnon des Arts et des Lettres du Québec in Québec, and the Governor General's Award in Canada, Lozano-Hemmer was born in Mexico and lives and works in Montréal.


Remain in the No Longer @ Open City Festival


