Celtic Connections Glasgow – January 2026



The perfect antidote to the January blues, Celtic Connections is Europe's foremost winter music festival and true to its motto: "Making January Sound Better." This year's edition had a distinctly Québécois resonance about it. Six bands – Bon Débarras, Cécilia, É.T.É, Germaine, La Déferlance and Paruline – were specially selected to perform as part of Showcase Scotland, the festival's five-day professional networking event, to demonstrate the vibrancy and innovation of Québec's traditional music.

My own love affair with Québécois music began back in 2010 when I first saw Le Vent du Nord perform. This year the spotlight was on the new generation who didn't disappoint. Delegates and festival-goers were charmed by the rapid-fire *podorythmie*, lively *gigues*, tongue-twisting *turluttes* and call-and-response *chansons à répondre* – all characteristics that make Québécois music so compelling and irresistibly conducive to dancing! A packed *veillée de danse* (ceilidh) at the legendary Old Fruitmarket was final confirmation that this was one of the strongest and most exuberant international showcases to date.

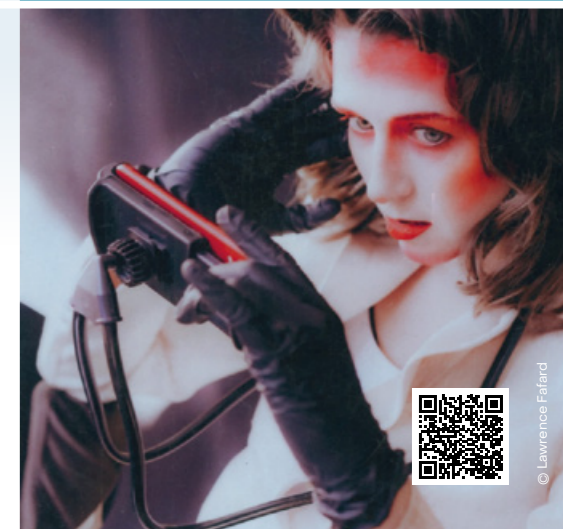

A prominent figure in Montréal's independent music scene for over twenty years, she gained recognition as the frontwoman of the cult bands Duchess Says and PyPy. Inspired by minimal pop and electronic pioneers, her debut album, *Les Manières de table*, is both danceable and disquieting, re-examining social codes of politeness.

Led by Anishinaabe musician Tashiina Buswa and English guitarist Billy Riley, Ribbon Skirt released their debut album *Bite Down* in April 2025 on Mint Records and quickly established the band as one of the most compelling new voices in indie music – earning Stereogum’s Album of the Week and a shortlist nomination for the 2025 Polaris Music Prize. Their sound is raw and enveloping, channelling angular guitars, driving rhythms, and lyrical threads that explore memory, love, grief, and Buswa’s relationship to her Indigenous heritage.

La Sécurité (Montréal/Tiohtià:ke) is a collective whose art punk is equal parts: jumpy beats, off-kilter arrangements and minimalistic melodic hooks; run through an insomniac filter, the result of excessive exposure to the city's neon lights. The music is all about living dangerously, perfectly agreeable to being blasted onto dancefloors; while the lyrics share the ethos of the Riot Grrrl movement, and celebrate the autonomisation of women, friends (mean and nice) as well as benevolence. The motley bunch meanders the fringes of punk, new wave and krautrock, mischievously flouting stylistic form every chance they get. These five scattered, yet creatively concerted entities also propose a wide arsenal of D.I.Y. music videos, visuals, screenprints, patented dance moves, et cetera!

Equally at home in solemn Arcadian ballads, swampy North African improvs, or classic rock and roll revelry, The Barr Brothers continue to embrace and enchant audiences with their methodical-yet-whimsical approach to music making.

RISE 2026 is Dance North Scotland's Festival of Contemporary Dance and Performance. From 23 May to 6 June, the festival will honour global Indigenous artists whose work connects land, story and movement.

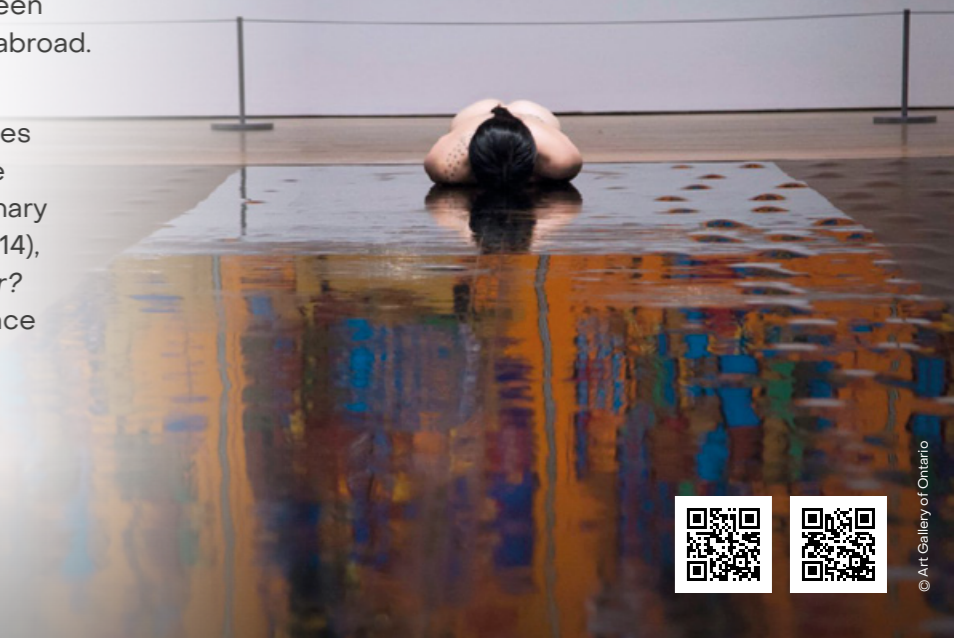
DAINA ASHBEE

Recognised as one of the most prolific choreographers of her generation, since 2015 Daina Ashbee's award-winning work has been presented over 100 times in 20 countries abroad.

Serpentine is an installation performance, repeated for up to 3 hours. The work vibrates the essence of Ashbee's dark and feminine pieces and is intended as an intense summary of her previous three works, *Unrelated* (2014), *When the ice melts, will we drink the water?* (2016) and *Pour* (2016), highlighting resilience and reclamation.

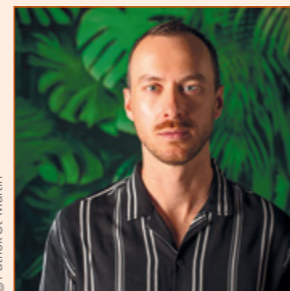
