Sexual exploitation often begins without warning. People from all walks of life can become victims.

Sexual exploitation is when one person takes advantage of another person's body for sexual purposes in order to gain a profit. There are many forms of sexual exploitation, but pimping (forcing a victim into prostitution to receive the proceeds) is one of the most common.

The average age of entry into prostitution in Canada is between 14 and 15 years old.

TRAPS (RECRUITMENT STRATEGIES OF THE EXPLOITER)

- Approaching the victim through friends, mutual acquaintances (bar, shopping mall, school outing, youth centre) or social media
- Seducing the victim and making that person feel as if the exploiter is entering into a loving relationship with him/her
- Promising a life of dreams and luxury by offering gifts or rewards to the victim
- Manipulating the victim by presenting sexual services as an opportunity to repay a debt

RISK FACTORS

- Having experienced stressful events, such as a difficult breakup
- Been physically, psychologically, or sexually abused
- Being in conflict with parents or running away from home
- Using drugs or alcohol
- Living in social isolation or exclusion
- Coming from an unhealthy background, whether disadvantaged or otherwise
- Looking for adventure or thrills

Some people believe that they can temporarily offer their sexual services. However, the reality is quite different. It is very difficult to get out of this situation, and the physical, psychological, and financial consequences are very serious indeed.
