

**Sharing a licence to hunt antlerless deer
Commitment**

Valid only in areas where permitted by regulation

By this form, the hunter with a licence to hunt antlerless deer and the hunters listed below agree to use the licence in accordance with the terms and conditions of the *Regulation respecting hunting activities* (C-61.1, r. 1) (see the terms and conditions on the next page).

Conditions to be met

- Upon entering the hunting area, the group of hunters must give the officer at the reception station a copy of the commitment form allowing each hunter to use the licence of another member of the group.
- Each hunter who signs the commitment must hold a valid hunting licence for the hunting area.
- Each hunter must carry a copy of the commitment when hunting and have their deer hunting licence on hand, even if the transportation coupon is no longer attached to it. The commitment must be shown to a wildlife protection officer or assistant protection officer upon request.

This measure allows members of a group of up to six people to agree to share a licence to hunt antlerless deer where the licence is valid. The licence is obtained by draw and issued to one member of the group. **The measure only applies to wildlife areas where regulations permit such a practice** and is subject to the following:

- The wildlife areas where the commitment is valid are wildlife preserves, outfitters with exclusive rights, the Bras-Coupé-Désert, Maganasipi, Pontiac, Rapides-des-Joachims, Restigo, Saint-Patrice, and Jaro ZECs (including private land covered by a memorandum of understanding) as well as Kenauk Nature X S.E.C, Seigneurie du Lac-Mitis, and Seigneurie du Nicolas-Rioux.
- Upon entering the hunting area, the group of hunters must give the officer at the reception station a copy of the commitment form allowing them to use the licence to hunt antlerless deer issued to one of them. The form includes the hunters' names and signatures, their valid white-tailed deer hunting licence numbers, the purpose of the commitment and its duration, the name of the area and the date of the commitment (see the form on page 1)
- The commitment is valid only while the hunters are in the wildlife area.
- Each person whose name appears on the commitment form may, for the term of the commitment, use the licence to hunt antlerless deer in the area concerned, as long as the licence holder is present in the area and until one of them kills an antlerless deer.
- The licence to hunt antlerless deer expires as soon as the antlerless deer is killed. The hunter who killed the deer must immediately attach their own transportation coupon to it. The hunter must also punch the designated section of the licence on the day the animal was killed.
- If the holder of the licence to hunt antlerless deer kills an antlerless deer, another hunter is still permitted to harvest an antlerless deer while the authorization is in effect, provided that the person holding the licence to hunt antlerless deer remains in the area.
- When registering the kill, the hunter who bagged the antlerless deer must present their regular licence as well as the licence to hunt antlerless deer under which the animal was harvested.

In wildlife areas where regulations allow for sharing, it is therefore up to the holder of a licence to hunt antlerless deer to decide whether to share their licence with the other hunters in the group when they enter the area.

It is also the responsibility of the members of the group to comply with the number of antlerless deer they are allowed to harvest. To avoid multiple kills, those involved in the antlerless deer hunt must ensure that they keep close to each other so that if a deer is killed, everyone in the group is aware of it.
