

## Sharing white-tailed deer licences Commitment

In wildlife areas where permitted by regulation

The hunters with white-tailed deer licences listed below agree to share their harvest limit in accordance with the terms and conditions of the *Regulation respecting hunting activities* (C-61.1, r. 1) (see the terms and conditions on the next page).

### Conditions to be met

- The wildlife areas where this commitment is valid are wildlife reserves, outfitters with exclusive rights, and Kenauk Nature X S.E.C, Seigneurie du Lac-Mitis, and Seigneurie du Nicolas-Rioux.
- Upon entering the hunting area, the group of hunters must give the officer at the reception station a copy of the commitment form allowing each hunter to use the licence of another member of the group.
- Each hunter who signs the commitment must hold a valid regular or supplemental white-tailed deer hunting licence for the zone or wildlife area in question.
- Each hunter must carry a copy of the commitment when hunting and have their deer hunting licence on hand, even if the transportation coupon is no longer attached to it. The commitment must be shown to a wildlife protection officer or assistant protection officer upon request.

This measure allows members of a group of up to six people to agree to share their white-tailed deer harvest limit. They can all hunt as long as one of the members of the group has a white-tailed deer hunting licence with a transportation coupon attached. The measure only applies to wildlife areas where regulations permit such a practice and is subject to the following:

- Upon entering the hunting area, the group of hunters must give the officer at the reception station a copy of the commitment form allowing each hunter to use the licence of another member of the group. The form includes the hunters' names and signatures, their valid white-tailed deer hunting licence numbers, the purpose of the commitment and its duration, the name of the area and the date of the commitment (see the form on page 1)
- The commitment is valid only while the hunters are in the wildlife area.
- During the term of the commitment, none of the members of the group can sign a similar commitment with another group of hunters.
- Each person whose name appears on the commitment form may, for the term of the commitment, use the white-tailed deer hunting licence of another member of the group in the area concerned, as long as one of them is carrying a valid deer hunting licence and is present in the area.
- When hunting, all the group members must carry a copy of the commitment and have their own hunting licence on hand, even if the transportation coupon has been removed. The commitment must be shown to a wildlife protection officer or assistant protection officer upon request.
- When a hunter kills a white-tailed deer, they must detach the transportation coupon from their own licence and attach it to the animal. If the hunter's coupon has already been used for another deer, they must take the transportation coupon from the licence of a person whose name appears on the commitment and who is present in the area and attach it to the animal the day the animal is killed.
- Each person must register the deer to which their transportation coupon is attached.

It is up to the hunters to decide whether they adhere to this commitment when they enter a wildlife area where this measure is authorized. The members of the group are responsible for complying with the limit on the number of deer they are allowed to kill. Anyone who takes part in the hunt, but no longer has a transportation coupon attached to their licence, must ensure that they always hunt near another member of the group with a valid coupon. They must be able to communicate with the other member at all times to avoid multiple kills.

To pool an antlerless deer licence obtained by random draw, hunters must sign another commitment on the form entitled Sharing an Antlerless Deer Licence.
