Instructions

General Instructions

The form Declaration of dative tutorship enables you to choose a person to act as tutor for your children of minor age in the event of your death or incapacity, tutor who will be responsible for them as well as their property. If such a situation were to occur, this document, which does not need to be authorized, would come into effect immediately, thereby preventing the court from appointing a tutor.



IMPORTANT : The wishes that apply are always those of the last parent to die or lose his ability to take on a tutorship role.

When both parents die or become incapable at the same time (for example, following a car accident), after having chosen different tutors, the court shall decide.

Parents

I Enter the name and contact information of the parents (in block letters, if written by hand). Each parent prepares his own declaration, as the case may be.

Children of minor age

Enter the name of all of your children under 18 years of age likely to be subject to the tutorship of the person you designate. If you run out of lines, use another page. You can also designate a tutor for children not yet born by checking the applicable box. If you want to designate a different tutor for one or more of your children, please fill in a different form for each one.

Designated persons

The chosen person must be of full age (or fully emancipated). The person can be Canadian or another nationality and may reside in Canada or in another country. The person must be able to exercise his civil rights and be in full possession of his mental faculties.

You can designate a single person who will be responsible for the person and the person's property.

OR

You can designate a tutor who will be responsible for the person and another person (or more than one) to administer the person's property. The tutor to the property can be a legal person, such as a trust company. You can also choose a replacement for each designated tutor, to which the same criteria will apply. If you run out of space, use another page.
