



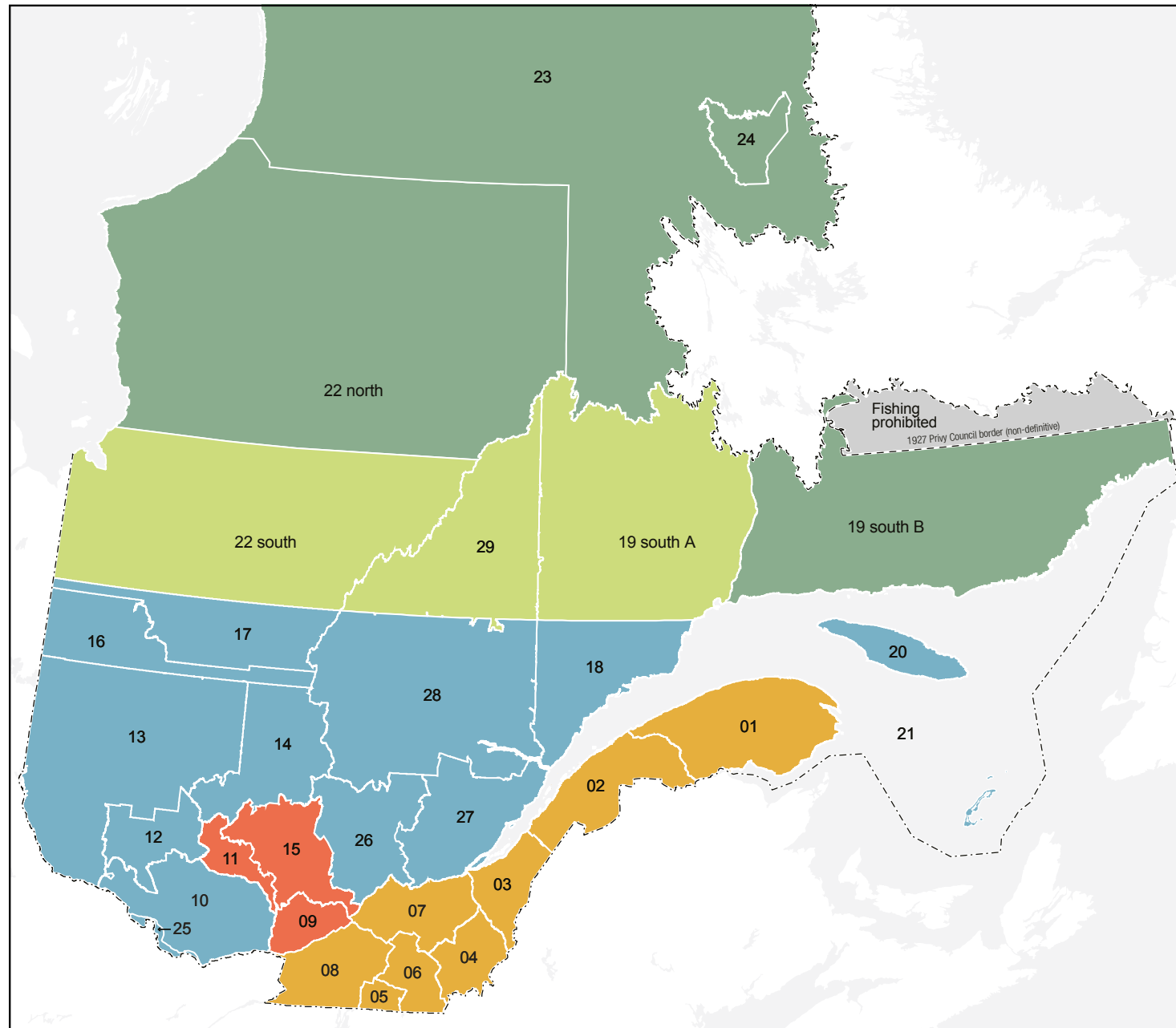
Québec's 2014-2024 Lake Trout Management Plan

Management Plan extended to 2024

The management guidelines and rules introduced for lake trout in 2014 will remain in force until 2024. However, some of the rules have been adjusted to allow for restoration of populations, ensure consistency and simplify the regulatory framework.

Minimum length of 55 cm in zones 9, 11 and 15



| Fishing zones | Permitted length | Catch and possession limit |
|---|------------------|-----------------------------|
| 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 | 60 cm and over | 2 |
| 9, 11 and 15 | 55 cm and over | 2 |
| 10, 12, 13, 14, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 25, 26, 27 and 28 | 45 cm and over | 2 |
| 19 south A, 22 south and 29 | Under 60 cm | 3 |
| 19 south B, 22 north, 23 and 24 | Under 60 cm | 3, including one over 60 cm |

Some exceptions apply.



Harmonization of the fishing season with the brook trout season

Fishing zones 1 to 7, 14, 15, 22, 23, 24 and 26 have a slightly longer lake trout fishing season.

| 21 | From April 1 st , 2020 to March 31 st , 2021 |
| 22, 23* and 24 | From June 1 st to September 7, 2020 |
| 25 | From April 24 to September 30, 2020 |
| 26 and 27 | From July 1 to September 13, 2020 |

Changes to the rules governing certain bodies of water

The rules applicable to certain bodies of water in different fishing zones will be amended to adjust size limits to fish growth. Winter fishing will be closed on some bodies of water where it was previously open, whereas other bodies of water will in future be open to winter fishing for species other than lake trout.
