



The “Being Vaccinated, It’s a Win!” Vaccination Contest Rules

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1. Two vaccination contest segments are being jointly run by the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux (MSSS), in partnership with Loto-Québec, which is in charge of draws and prize payments. One contest is open to adults only, while the other is open to adolescents aged 12 to 17 years.

The vaccination contest initiative is aimed at maximizing the Québec vaccination level for all age categories—especially youth—and offering vaccinated people a chance to win valuable prizes. Every person who is vaccinated has also taken a decision that benefits the entire population. It is very important for everyone who already has their first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine to get their second dose by August 31 and reap the benefits of optimal long-term protection, including protection from the variants of the virus.

1.2. **Loto-Québec and the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux**

La Société des loteries du Québec and the MSSS are jointly responsible for organizing and promoting the contest.

2. ELIGIBILITY

2.1. THE VACCINATION CONTEST DRAWS FOR ADULT PARTICIPANTS

Adults must meet the following conditions in order to qualify for the draws reserved for the adult population:

- a) Be included in the Québec Vaccination Registry, which is maintained by the Minister of Health and Social Services per the *Act Respecting Health Services and Social Services*, CQLR c S-4.2

Anyone that is vaccinated in Québec is automatically included in the vaccination registry. People who were vaccinated outside Québec may add their information to the registry using the procedure set out on the appropriate quebec.ca website page: <https://www.quebec.ca/en/health/health-issues/a-z/2019-coronavirus/progress-of-the-covid-19-vaccination/vaccinated-for-covid-19-outside-quebec-using-vaccination-registry>).

- b) Is at least 18 years of age at the time of a draw.
- c) Has received a first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine by the August 2021 draw dates (August 6, 13, 20 and 27, respectively).
- d) Has received two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine by the September 3, 2021, draw.
- e) Has been diagnosed positive for COVID-19—only one dose of the vaccine is required for participation in all draws;
- f) Has registered on the vaccination proof portal per section 5 of the Act.

- g) Is not on the exclusion list set out in section 3.
- h) Has consented to participate in the contest and communicate the personal information required for participation.

2.2. THE VACCINATION CONTEST DRAWS FOR YOUTH AGED 12-17 YEARS

Youth participants aged 12-17 years must meet the following conditions in order to qualify for the draws reserved for their age group (registration for the contest and draw participation for youth under 14 years of age must be handled by the holder of parental authority).

The requirements for youth participants are as follows:

- a) Be included in the Québec Vaccination Registry.

Anyone that is vaccinated in Québec is automatically included in the vaccination registry. People who were vaccinated outside Québec may add their information to the registry using the procedure set out on the appropriate quebec.ca website page: <https://www.quebec.ca/en/health/health-issues/a-z/2019-coronavirus/progress-of-the-covid-19-vaccination/vaccinated-for-covid-19-outside-quebec-using-vaccination-registry>.
- b) Has not reached the age of 18 years at the time of a draw.
- c) Has received a first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine by the August 2021 draws (August 6, 13, 20 and 27, respectively).
- d) Has received two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine by the September 3, 2021, draw.
- e) Has been diagnosed positive for COVID-19—only one dose of the vaccine is required for participation in all draws;
- f) Has been registered on the vaccination proof portal by a person holding parental authority for them, per section 5 of the Act.
- g) Has consented to participate in the contest and communicate personal information required for participation.

3. The following people are not eligible for the draws:

- a) The Minister of Health and Social Services
- b) The Minister of Finance
- c) Office of the Minister of Health and Social Services staff
- d) Office of the Minister of Finance staff
- e) The Deputy Minister of Health and Social Services
- f) The Deputy Minister of Finance
- g) Managers of the MSSS vaccination campaign
- h) Staff at the MSSS Direction générale des technologies de l'information (DGTI) involved in organizing the contest (who have access to the list of participants and their information)
- i) Staff at Akinox involved in organizing the contest (who have access to the list of participants and their information)

4. DURATION

- 4.1. The contest registration portal will be available from 8 a.m. on July 25, 2021, to 11:59 p.m. on August 21, 2021. Registration for draws that have not yet occurred may take place at any time during this period.
- 4.2. Only one registration is needed to qualify for all forthcoming draws.

5. HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- 5.1. Eligibility for participation in the contest requires registration on the Proof of Vaccination against COVID-19 portal at <https://covid19.quebec.ca/PreuveVaccinale> and filling out the contest consent and personal information form.
- 5.2. Each eligible person can only register once. Their entry remains valid for all forthcoming draws.
- 5.3. Registration for the contest and draws for youth under 14 years of age must be handled by the holder of parental authority.
- 5.4. Every registrant that has reached the age of 18 years at the time of a draw is eligible for the adult prizes awarded at that draw.
- 5.5. No one may win more than one prize in the August draws that are associated with the first vaccine dose.
- 5.6. Winners of a prize in the August draws associated with the first vaccine dose are eligible for the September 3, 2021, draws associated with the second vaccine dose.

6. DRAWS AND PRIZE DESCRIPTIONS

6.1. VACCINATION CONTEST DRAWS FOR ADULT PARTICIPANTS

- In order to encourage adults to receive their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, the vaccination contest for adult participants will draw weekly cash prizes of \$150,000 (one hundred fifty thousand dollars—total combined value of \$600,000—six hundred thousand dollars) between August 1 and August 27, 2021 (August 6, 13, 20 and 27) among registered individuals that have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine.
- On September 3, 2021, the vaccination contest for adult participants will draw one prize of \$1,000,000 (one million dollars—total value \$1,000,000) among registered individuals that have received two doses of COVID-19 vaccine.

6.2. VACCINATION CONTEST FOR YOUTH AGED 12-17 YEARS

- In order to encourage youth aged 12-17 years to receive their first dose of vaccine, the vaccination contest for youth aged 12 to 17 years will draw two weekly prizes of \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) between August 1 and August 27, 2021 (August 6, 13, 20 and 27) from among registered recipients of their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, a total value of \$80,000 (eighty thousand dollars), payable per the prize award rules set out in section 10 herein.

- In order to encourage youth aged 12-17 years to receive their second dose, a total of 16 (sixteen) prizes \$20,000 (twenty thousand dollars) each, a total value of \$320,000 (three hundred twenty thousand dollars) will be drawn on September 3, 2021, from among registered recipients of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine and payable per the prize award rules set out in section 10 herein.
- Winners not enrolled at an educational institution by the end of their 21st year of age will receive payment of the balance or full amount of their prize, as the case may be at that time.
- Participants do not receive their prize until they have begun post-secondary studies.
- Participants can only benefit from their prize per the prize award rules set out in section 10 herein.

6.3. ADDITIONAL PRIZES

- The Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux reserves the right to offer prizes that are additional to the ones already described in the rules. In this case, the additional prize draw will be held on September 3, 2021, among all eligible draw registrants. The list of additional prizes will be available on the website of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux.

All draws are made and supervised by authorized representatives of Loto-Québec.

7. A PARTICIPATION DRAWN IS DEEMED VALID AND IN COMPLIANCE

- 7.1. If the participation drawn is deemed valid and in compliance with the rules of the contest, the winner will receive one of the prizes. A representative of the MSSS will, by telephone, contact the winner or holder of parental authority of a winner of minor age, as the case may be, to inform them of the win and explain the terms and conditions that must be fulfilled in order to receive the prize.

8. A PARTICIPATION DRAWN IS DEEMED INVALID AND NOT IN COMPLIANCE

- 8.1. If the participation drawn is deemed invalid and/or not in compliance with the rules of the contest, or the person whose participation was drawn does not comply with the terms and conditions of the rules, their participation will be cancelled.

9. PRIZE AWARD PROCEDURE—ADULTS

- 9.1. A representative of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux will contact winners designated per section 7 of the rules herein to confirm the prize won and relevant details and prize claim procedures. Winners will then have 48 hours to confirm their acceptance of the awarded prize per Loto-Québec terms and conditions, failing which they will not be entitled to the prize nor to any compensation of any kind whatsoever.
- 9.2. At the time of prize claim, Loto-Québec may require the winner to show non-expired government-issued photo ID. After the winner's identity has been validated and confirmed, as well as attestation made of compliance with the rules of the contest, the winner will receive the prize as described in section 6 of the rules herein and per the terms and conditions determined by Loto-Québec.

10. PRIZE AWARD PROCEDURE–YOUTH 12-17 YEARS OF AGE

- 10.1.** A representative of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux will contact winners designated per section 7 of the rules herein or, as applicable, their holder of parental authority to confirm the prize won and relevant details and prize claim procedures. Winners and their holder of parental authority will then have 48 hours to confirm their acceptance of the awarded prize per Loto-Québec terms and conditions, failing which they will not be entitled to the prize nor to any compensation of any kind whatsoever.
- 10.2.** At the time of prize claim, Loto-Québec may require the winner to show non-expired government-issued photo ID. After the winner's identity has been validated and confirmed, as well as attestation made of compliance with the rules of the contest, the winner's prize will be paid to Fiducie Desjardins Inc., which will hold full prize administration power for and on behalf of the prizewinner, until the following:
- The value of the prize has been exhausted through repayment of the winner's postsecondary education tuition and related expenses, the whole consistent with the terms and conditions determined by Loto-Québec;
- OR
- The winner has reached the end of their 21st year of age;
- OR
- The winner is deceased, in which case the prize or remainder will be paid to the legal administrator of the winner's estate after proof of registration of the administrator as liquidator in the Register of personal and movable real rights has been produced, as provided in section 777 of the Civil Code of Québec.
- 10.3.** Should the winner be declared incapacitated by a decision of the Superior Court of Québec prior to receiving the prize or any remaining amount, the outstanding amount will be paid to winner's legal representative once the winner has reached the end of their 21st year of age and after documentary proof of the identity of the legal representative has been received by Fiducie Desjardins Inc.
- 10.4.** The winner and the winner's holder of parental authority hereby authorizes Loto-Québec and/or the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux to share all personal information deemed relevant for the purpose of administering the prize with Fiducie Desjardins Inc.
- 10.5.** The winner and the winner's holder of parental authority promise to sign all documents deemed relevant by Fiducie Desjardins Inc., including account opening documents to enable Loto-Québec to award the prize and its administration by Fiducie Desjardins Inc.

11. NAME, ADDRESS AND PHOTOGRAPH

The winner's name, administrative region and photograph will be used to release information about the winners, including any other information they may have voluntarily provided. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, dissemination channels may also include the Internet (including social media). No broadcast, print or advertising rights can be claimed by the winner in this regard.

12. OTHER RESTRICTIONS

- 12.1.** Loto-Québec and the Minister of Health and Social Services reserve the right to cancel the contests in whole or in part or to delay them for any reason whatsoever, including accidents and/or force majeure. Loto-Québec and the MSSS may also amend the rules of the contest at any time, in which case the amended rules will be made available to the public.
- 12.2.** Loto-Québec and the Minister of Health and Social Services shall incur no liability to any party if the contest is cancelled, delayed or amended or in case of computer failure or malfunction.
- 12.3.** Loto-Québec and the Minister of Health and Social Services shall not be held liable for any situation, incident or other event that prevents any individual from meeting the participation and/or prize claim deadlines, as the case may be.
- 12.4.** Failure to comply with the rules herein or utterance of false declarations by a participant and/or cheating, fraud, collusion or association with a related third party for combinational purposes shall automatically lead to cancellation of the participant's entry in the contest and disqualification from all other contest-related draws.

13. DISPUTES

- 13.1.** Disputes relating to draw registration must be submitted to the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux.
- 13.2.** Disputes relating to the conduct of the contest and prize awarding are governed by the contest rules herein and the Sales promotion games By-law, CQLR c S-13.1, r 4.

14. AVAILABILITY OF CONTEST RULES

The contest rules are available at all times on the Québec.ca website and on the portal when registering for the contest.
